

**JOINT RESOLUTION
OF THE
UNIFIED FIRE SERVICE AREA (Resolution No. _____)
AND OF THE
TOWN OF ALTA (Resolution No. 2020-R-6)
DECLARING AN INTENT TO ADJUST THE BOUNDARY OF THE UNITED FIRE
SERVICE AREA TO INCLUDE THE TOWN OF ALTA**

WHEREAS, the Unified Fire Service Area (“UFSA”) is a special district for fire protection and emergency medical services

WHEREAS, the Town of Alta (“Alta”) is a municipal corporation and political subdivision of the State of Utah;

WHEREAS, having considered the matter, the Board of Trustees of UFSA and the Alta Town Council have concluded that it is in the best interests of each and of the property owners and future residents in the affected area for UFSA and Alta to adjust the boundary of the local district to include the municipality, specifically to add the entire boundary of the Town of Alta to UFSA, in accordance with the requirements of Utah Code Ann. § 17B-1-503 and § 17B-1-417.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED and enacted by the Board of Trustees of the Unified Fire Service Area and by the Alta Town Council as follows:

1. That the Board of Trustees of UFSA and the Alta Town Council hereby declare their intent to adjust the boundary of the UFSA to include the Town of Alta such that the “Affected Area,” which is identified in attached Exhibit “A” and incorporated herein by reference, will be added to UFSA.
2. That this Resolution is adopted by the board of UFSA and the Alta Town Council for the purpose of fulfilling and complying with the requirements of Utah Code Ann. §§ 17B-1-503 and 17B-1-417(3)(a) to initiate the statutory procedure for adjusting the boundary of the UFSA to include the Town of Alta.
3. That the UFSA Board of Trustees and the Alta Town Council shall hold a joint public hearing on the proposed boundary adjustment no less than 60 days after the adoption of this Joint Resolution.
4. That a notice that this Joint Resolution was adopted and that public hearings are to be held shall be provided in accordance with the requirements of Utah Code Ann. §§ 17B-1-417(3)(a)(iii) through -417(3)(c), which notice shall either be published once a week for two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within both jurisdictions, with the first publication of the notice to be not later than 14 days after the adoption of this Joint Resolution, or the notice shall be mailed to each owner of property located within the affected area and to each registered voter residing within the affected area. No later than 14 days after the adoption of this Joint Resolution, the notice shall also be published for two weeks on the Utah Public Notice Website.

5. That the required notice may be given jointly by UFSA and Alta.

6. That, after the joint public hearing, the UFSA Board and the Town of Alta may adopt a joint resolution adjusting the UFSA boundary unless, at or before the public hearings, the requisite number of written protests to the boundary adjustment have been filed with the UFSA Board and the Town of Alta as provided by law, and may take other steps necessary to complete the boundary adjustment.

7. That, if the requisite number of protests are filed, the boundary adjustment shall be abandoned.

8. That this Joint Resolution has been placed on the agenda of a UFSA Board of Trustees meeting and of an Alta Town Council meeting and this action is taken in compliance with the Utah Open and Public Meetings Act.

9. That this Resolution shall take effect immediately when it has been approved by both the Board of Trustees of UFSA and by the Alta Town Council in accordance with the dates set forth below.
