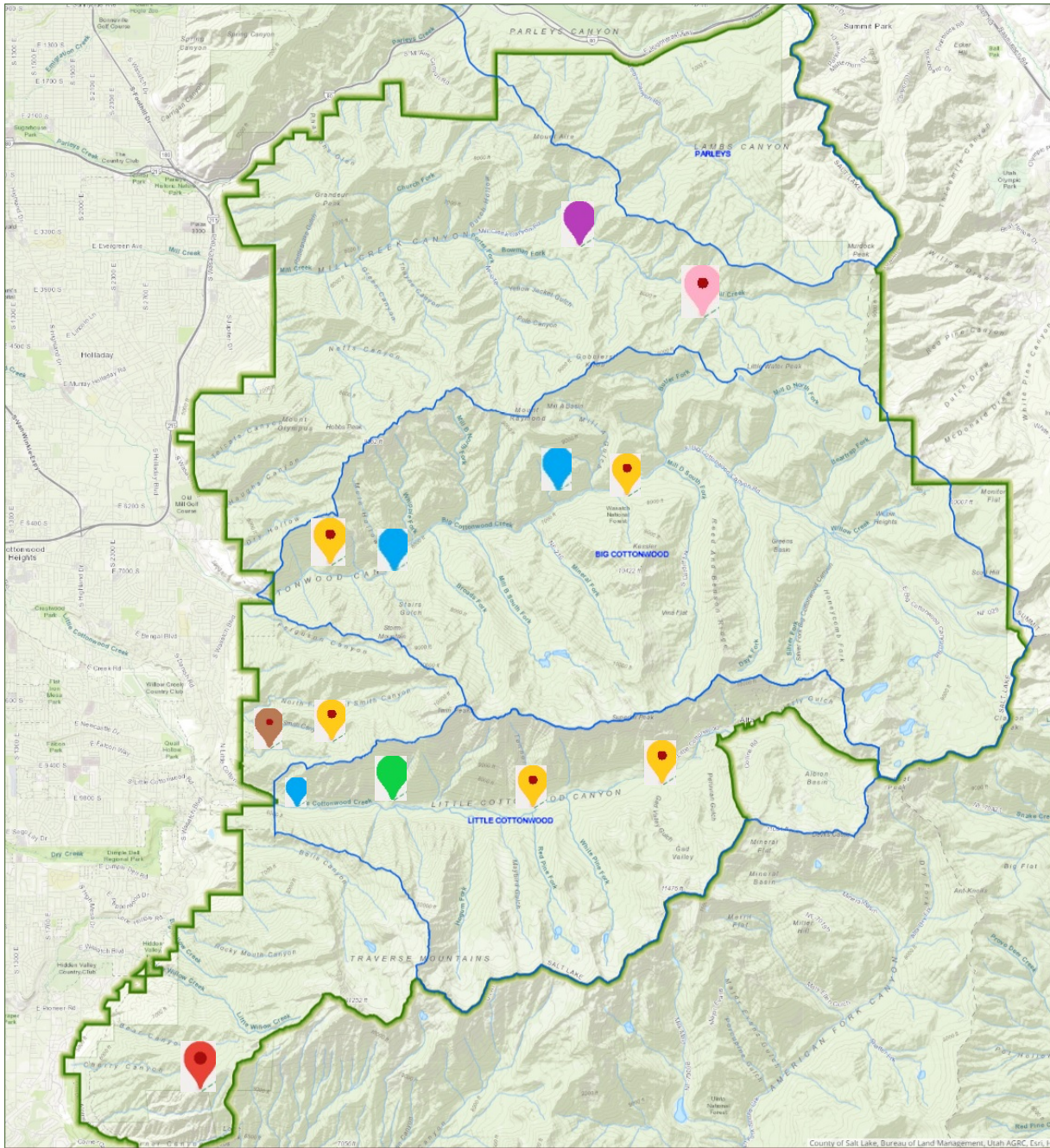












Central Wasatch Commission Short Term Projects Map
