Ordinance No. 2020-O-5

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TOWN CODE TITLE 5, (PUBLIC SAFETY), CHAPTER 2 (ANIMAL CONTROL), SECTION 3 (DOG LICENSING), SECTION K (EXEMPTIONS TO LICENSING)

WHEREAS, the Town of Alta has an interest in promoting public health, safety, and welfare:

- **WHEREAS**, The Town's current ordinance language does not recognize all Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) services and animal functions;
- **WHEREAS**, Ordinance 5-2-3 section K should be updated to be compliant with federal law as proposed by the tracked changes below
- **WHEREAS**, the Town of Alta finds the proposed amendments in the best interest of the residents of the Town of Alta;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF ALTA, UTAH THAT:

Section I: 5-2-3 Amended

- K. Exemptions To Licensing:
 - 1. The fee provisions of this section and licensing requirement shall not apply to:
- a. A Service Animal as defined by the American Disability Act (ADA), specifically, a dog that has been individually trained to do work or perform tasks for an individual with a disability. Seeing eye dogs properly trained to assist blind persons if such dogs are actually being used by blind persons to assist them in moving from place to place.
- b. Hearing dogs properly trained to assist deaf persons if such dogs are actually used by deaf persons to aid them in responding to sounds. (Ord. 1994-O-3, 2-10-1994; amd. Ord. 2014-O-3, 3-13-2014)
- <u>be</u>. Dogs required for search and rescue operations or extraordinary circumstances for which the town marshal requires additional assistance for public safety

as allowed by the mayor or town marshal on a temporary basis. (Ord. 1995-O-4, 11-9-1995; amd. Ord. 2014-O-3, 3-13-2014)

<u>Section II: Effective Date.</u> This Ordinance shall become effective upon publication.
