USFS & UDOT Coordination

USFS

Involvement:

- Owns most of the public parking in Alta
- All parking management requires a Special-use Permit

What they need in a parking plan:

- Equity
- Preserve historical use



UDOT

Involvement:

- Manage SR-210
- Plow snow in winter



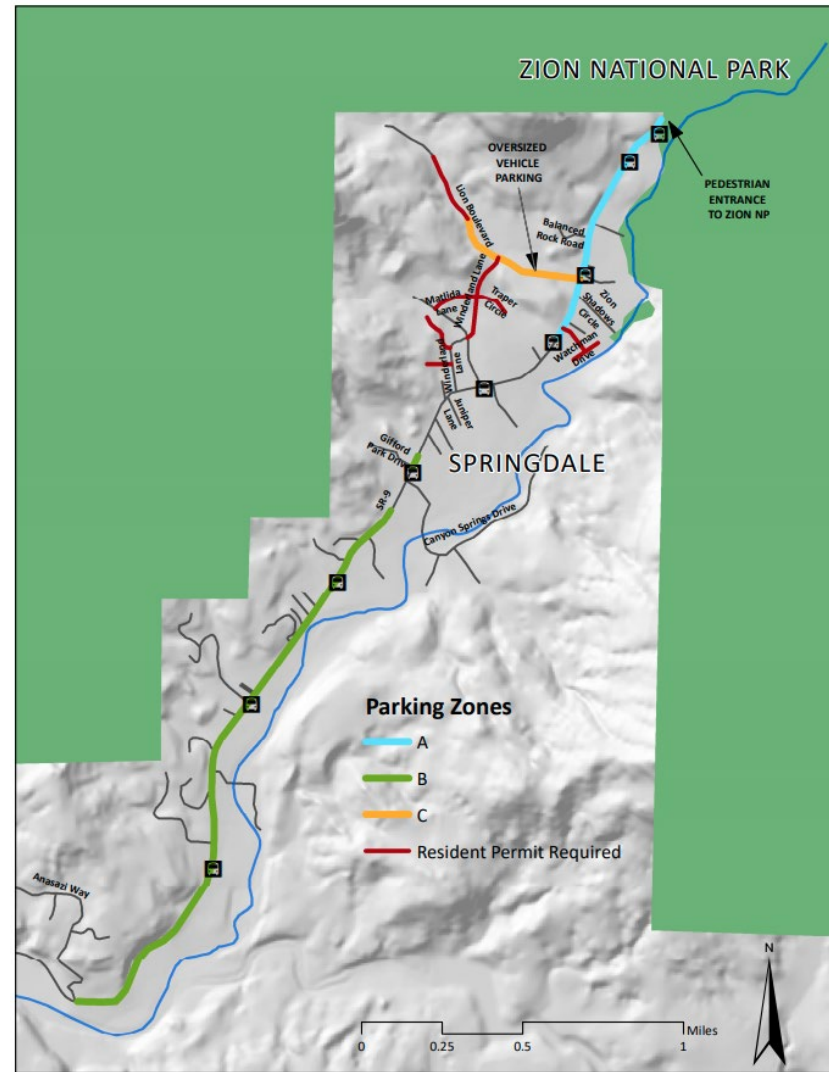
What they need in a parking plan:

- Traffic operations preserved
- No impact to safety

Comparable
Sites

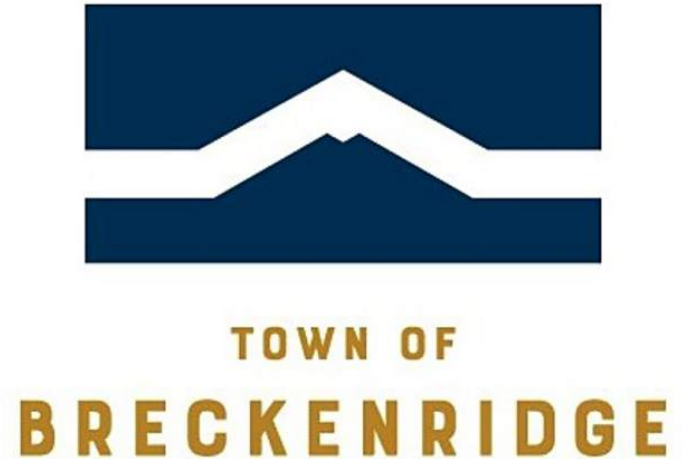
Springdale, Utah

- Visitors
 - Park in paid parking areas
 - Fees vary by location
- Residents
 - Allotted two permits
 - Permit parking is location restricted
- Employees
 - Assumed to park on-site or in residential permit areas



Breckenridge, Colorado

- Visitors
 - Park in paid parking areas
 - Fees vary by location and length of stay
- Residents
 - Location restricted permits
 - Must be approved by town hall
- Employees
 - Permits, assigned to a certain lot
 - Ski employees required to park in satellite lots and shuttle
 - Skiers required to park in Ski Area lot

The Passport Parking app is available for Apple and Android phones and provides the most convenient way to park - pay - and be on your way. To start a parking session, you'll first need to find your zone number. Zone numbers are posted on signs on every block as well as on each meter. Below is a complete list of zone numbers for quick reference. Enter your license plate, length of stay, payment information and off you go. 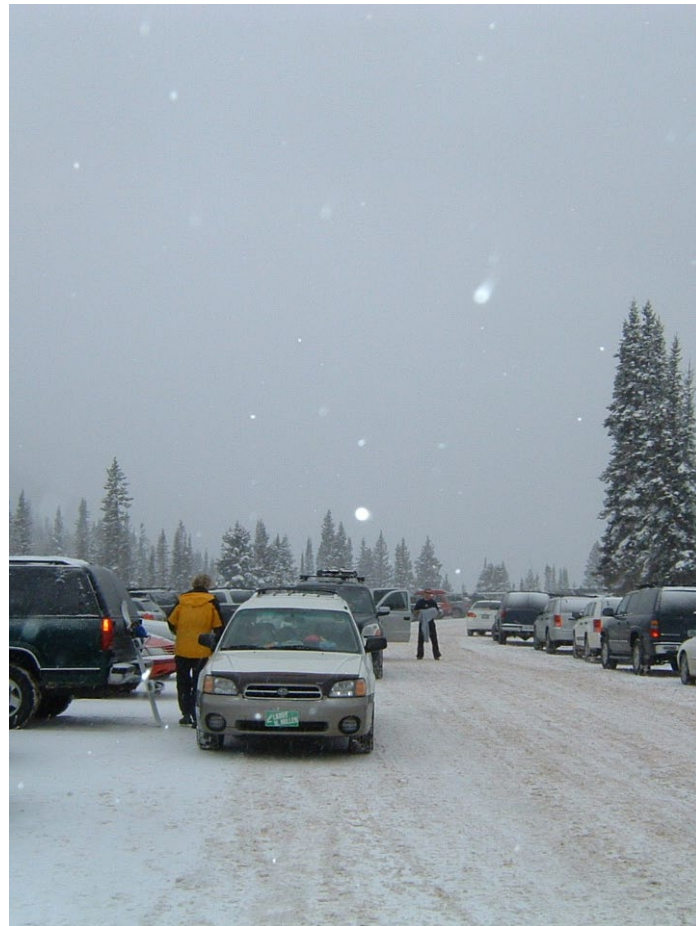

Early Takeaways

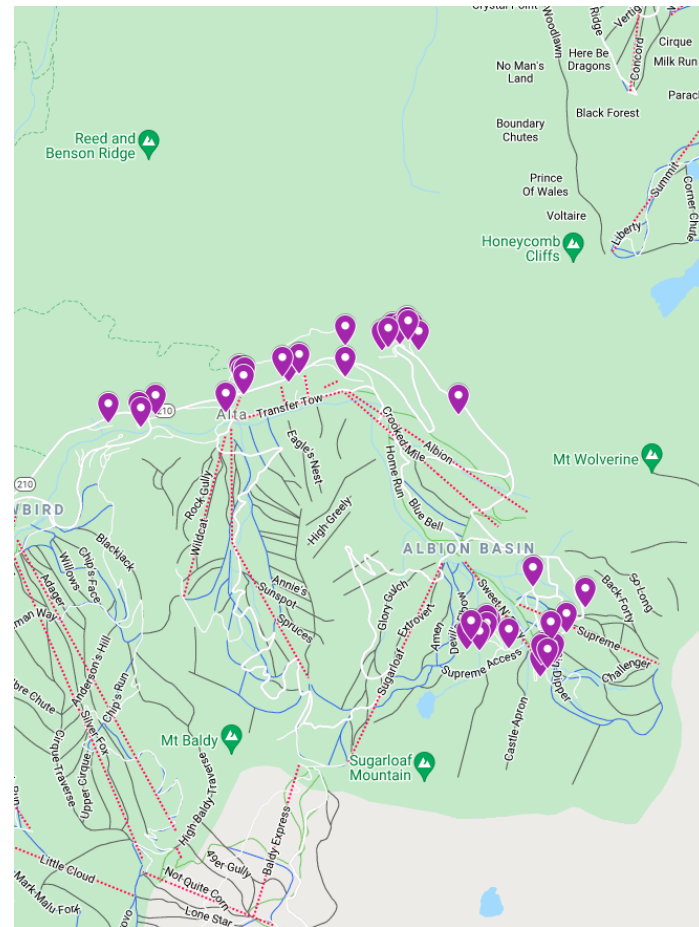
Common themes in survey responses:
