Responsibilities included management of 185 square miles of watershed, source of water supplies, distribution of culinary water, irrigation systems, sewer collection and treatment, storm water collection and permitting. Jeff was responsible for implementing a Storm Water Utility for Salt Lake City. This included developing overall Storm Water Master Plans for Salt Lake City. He wrote and implemented the City's storm water quality program required under the EPA storm water regulations.
