

















Ski Bus-Bypass Program

- The CWC has collaborated with Sandy City and UTA since 2021 to provide an escort for the UTA ski bus, starting from the UTA Park N' Ride lot on 9400 South to the base of Little Cottonwood Canyon.
- Since 2021, the CWC has contributed just under \$75,000 to Sandy City to provide this service and help incentivize public transit and mitigate ski traffic.

Little Cottonwood Canyon Backcountry Ski Shuttle

• The CWC has funded this shuttle service through its Short-Term Projects grant program since 2022. This shuttle helps mitigate ski traffic on Wasatch Blvd and on SR210.
